Regular Appointments

10:45 Chief Deputy Pete Eng/Deputy Cory Borg

Eng and Borg met with the Commissioners to discuss several items. Eng presented several stats for Sheriff's Office; 99 calls for service between 2-8-16 and 3-9-2016; 1180 calls for service June 2015 to March 9 2016 after Watertown PD took over 911 Center; 339 total case reports from Aug. 2015 to 3-9-2016; 80 sets of civil papers served from Jan. 1 to March 9, 2016. Eng said the Sheriff's Dept. could be doing blood testing for Highway Dept. crew; policy for testing after an accident Grant County uses the federal guidelines and Lake County has their own policy. Eng said VA mental health patients may have to be transferred to St. Cloud MN and if so Eng asked that the county secure a credit card so Sheriff's Dept. could use when traveling. Eng said that during the rodeo in Clear Lake the city would like an additional officer in town; Clear Lake city would pay half of deputy salary \$10 hr. for 12 hour shift for three days or 36 hours and county pay \$10.00 hr. for 36 hrs. Thurs. Friday, Sat. 5) DeJong moved, seconded by Pederson to hire Jim Lentsch for rodeo weekend as additional officer 36 hrs. and pay \$10 per hour along with City of Clear Lake. All voted yes and the motion carried. Eng also talked about swearing in officers hired by the rodeo committee and recommended the county not swear them in. Eng would like to see two officers in the cars at all times during the rodeo and would like to hire three part time certified deputies. It was suggested that a member of the Rodeo Committee come to the next Commission meeting and discuss the additional personnel needed during the rodeo. Eng also said that with the increase in crime and court cases there is a need to look into the state certified police program, Reserve Law Enforcement Officers Program; once they are a reserve officer they have a year to become certified; can't work more than 40 hrs. a month, can't replace a regular deputy schedule; can use them as second man in patrol car; would be fully deputized; can't be by themselves. 6) DeJong moved, seconded by Rhody to implement the Reserve Law Enforcement Officers program in Deuel County. All voted yes and the motion carried. Eng also said there is a need for an additional full time officer so schedule can be filled and officers can have a weekend

off. 7) Pederson moved, seconded by DeJong to hire full time deputy and phase out one part time deputy and reduce schedule of other part time deputy by one day per week. All voted yes and the motion carried.

Deputy Borg requested approval for travel. 8) Pederson moved, seconded by DeJong to approve payment of travel for Borg to attend classes in Sioux Falls May 2-6 and ICS class May 19 & 20. All voted yes and the motion carried.

11:30 Goodwin Township

Goodwin Township Board members met with the Commissioners to discuss the possible purchase of gravel from the county pit known as the Swanz pit. Keith Goens said they would like to be able to utilize that pit since they are located so close to it. Superintendent Hintz said they try to service county roads on the north end of the county out of the Swanz pit and service south end out of another pit; Hintz said he wants to keep that supply of gravel for county roads.
